# **CM Basics**

#### Requester's Basic Instruction

If you know of a woman with cancer whom you would like to receive a CM comforter and journal you may contact Comforter Ministry, Inc. and request they be sent to her, providing the recipient's name and complete mailing address. A cover letter will be included, stating YOU are the one requesting they be sent.

#### **Quilter(s) Basic Instructions**

- Make your quilt according to CM "Criteria for Making and Donating a Comforter" (criteria by request to CM or go to CM Website). Make sure your name, city, state and date you finished your quilt are displayed in some permanent method on the back of your quilt.
- Request CM journal, and fill out "Greetings from the Quilter" page of journal.
- Provide three (3) colored pictures (preferably all the same) of your quilt.
- Send Quilt, Journal and Pictures to Comforter Ministry, Inc.
- All materials, including postage are covered by Quilter(s).

#### **Recipient's Basic Instructions**

Between the cover letter and CM journal all details are provided and explained, including the following:

- who made the request CM comforter/journal be sent to you
- brief explanation of CM
- what to do with the comforter/journal
- when ready to do so, you or your family have several options, including 1) sending comforter/journal back to Comforter Ministry, Inc. 2) sending them on to another woman with cancer 3) keeping both – With option 1 or 2, postage is covered by recipient or recipient's family.
- what to do with the comforter/journal before sending them back to CM or on to another woman with cancer

REMEMBER - IF YOU KNOW OF A WOMAN DIAGNOSED WITH CANCER AND WOULD LIKE ME TO SEND HER A COMFORTER MINISTRY QUILT AND JOURNAL, PLEASE CONTACT ME!

# Sharing What I Know . . .

# PART 3 of 4 LIVING WITH CANCER - A DAY AT A TIME

**Survive what is merely survivable.** Before your cancer diagnosis, you may have had an idealistic vision of how you would handle such a crisis. When faced with the challenge of cancer treatment, you may have resolved not merely to endure, but somehow to breeze through it.

Cancer is an awful disease. Its treatments can be wretched. If you are just getting into the active phase of therapy, seasoned cancer patients urge you to do only what is necessary to get by. If keeping a positive outlook seems too taxing during he worst of your medical care, give your permission to just "be."

**Forgive yourself.** Perhaps treatments are just an unpleasant memory but you still wince when you remember your behavior during that ordeal. Or maybe you're feeling responsible for becoming ill in the first place.

If you are displeased with the way you dealt with the past, talk with loved ones and your healthcare professionals. They may be able to give you a more realistic appraisal.

Remember, you wouldn't be reading this now if you were not a survivor. If you have endured cancer chemotherapy, radiation, or surgical treatments, you have a lot to be proud of. This is a good time to forgive yourself for being human.

**Learn to reduce your stress level.** Psychoneuroimmunology is becoming a part of many medical treatments these days. Though the word is scary, the concept is simple. It refers to the new scientific field that studies how the mind and emotions affect physical well-being.

Studies have shown that stress, from whatever source, has a detrimental effect on the immune system. Your best chance of improving your quality of life is by reducing all your areas of stress.

Some people find self-hypnosis, guided imagery, or exercise helpful in relaxing. Others feel energized when they devote themselves to being of service to those around them. Still others find a consistent program of spiritual meditation or reading gives their lives emotional balance.

#### WELS HOMESCHOOLERS

For some time I have wanted to reach out to the homeschooling community within WELS and beyond to share my vision of a partnership between homeschoolers and the Comforter Ministry.

As homeschool parents looking ahead to the new school year, you may want to consider a service activity for your student(s) which could assist you in helping to instill a heart for service in your child/children or even entire family.

The Comforter Ministry has various areas where such service opportunities exist. Here are just a few:

- Handmade note cards (blank inside) with envelopes I use note cards to write a personal, handwritten note to each CM recipient when I send her a CM quilt and CM journal. Stamps, stencils, stickers, drawings, and words of Scripture are a few of the creative ways others have chosen to make their "work of art" note cards for CM.
- Handmade bookmarks I like to include a bookmark with each CM journal sent to a CM recipient along with the accompanying CM quilt. Bookmarks of all types have been sent to CM, including crocheted, lace-trimmed, felt, ribbons, colored card stock, etc. Some have had words of encouragement or words of Scripture written on them. Handmade drawings or stenciling are some other ideas. Be Creative!
- Purse-size Tissue/Fabric Holder Fabric choices are endless for this project. CM recipients can take them to cancer treatments or have bed-side as needed.
- Quilt Why not? Check out the CM Web site at <u>www.comfortermiistry.com</u> under How the Ministry Works and click "I am a quilter and would like to make and donate a quilt" for a brief list of criteria.
- Fundraisers Financial assistance is ALWAYS appreciated to cover expenses and projects. Host an "event" with CM as the recipient of funds raised! I can send brochures, posters, etc. to assist;)
- PRAYERS Prayers for CM, CM Recipients, Caregivers, Medical Community/Research!
   Have a Prayer Gathering (again, see CM Web site and click Other and then Prayer
   Gathering). Or use the Prayer List found on the Web site under News, Notes, and
   Newsletters (keep scrolling down to list) and pray for CM Recipients on a regular basis.
- USE the Comforter Ministry Request a CM quilt and journal be sent to a woman YOU know who has been diagnosed with cancer...gifts I send on your behalf at no cost to you.

#### **DAY 44**

Dear Friends in Christ, There are the lines of my favorite Easter hymn.

> "The foe was triumphant when on Calvary, The Lord of creation was nailed to the tree. In Satan's domain did the hosts shout and jeer, For Jesus was slain, whom the evil ones fear."

But short was their triumph; the Savior arose, And death, hell and Satan he vanquished, his foes. The conquering Lord lifts his banner on high; He lives, yes, he lives and will nevermore die."

I often think of cancer in the same way. Cancer was laughing and jeering. It was surging forth thinking that it had defeated Kris. It was ready to claim another victory. But, just then, our dearest Lord snatched victory away. That evil cancer was turned on its head as the Lord just simply used this disease to proclaim his glory - to share the good news of peace through Jesus and to rescue another child from this world. This took place during Kris's lifetime, as I am convinced that there will be people in heaven who were strengthened by Kris's example of faith. And then there remained nothing but sweet rest in the heavenly home. This morning, our Lord said to Kris, 'Enough my child. You have suffered enough. Your journey is over, Look, I am opening the door to heaven. Come on in - here, you are so weak, but let me carry you through the door, and look around you. Look at the glory I have prepared for you. Look, here is your room that I have prepared. Over there - do you see them, there is your father and your sisters and all the other loved ones. There is Abraham and Moses, but most importantly, there is your heavenly Father. Go ahead, he is waiting for you - Go climb up on his lap and let him give you the hug of eternity.' For we who are left behind, know that our journey continues. So ends this chapter of our journey together. Our family has been strengthened by the many e-mails, cards and words given to us. Now, what remains is the glorious celebration of victory...One last word: for those of you who have walked with us for so long, if there is any one lesson to take from all this, it is certainly not bitterness or resentment. Not if we truly can imagine the glory of heaven. Rather, Kris's journey ought to remind us that we are all just on our journey of faith. That journey of faith can only be traveled one way - that is by faith in Jesus. Turn to him, and may he guide you and us through this life to our heavenly home. God's Blessings, my dear friends,
