### **Sharing What I Know**

Because the Comforter Ministry's mission is to reach out to some with cancer, each Comforter Ministry Newsletter will include information about a specific cancer or a related subject. By being better informed about cancer, my hope is that readers will be aided in detecting cancer in regard to themselves and others and, if necessary, know where to go for further information and qualified assistance.

#### **KIDNEY CANCER - Part 1**

KIDNEY CANCER: WHO'S AT RISK?

Kidney cancer develops most often in people over 40, but no one knows the exact causes of this disease. Doctors can seldom explain why one person develops kidney cancer and another does not. However, it is clear that kidney cancer is not contagious. No one can "catch" the disease from another person.

Research has shown that people with certain risk factors are more likely than others to develop kidney cancer. A risk factor is anything that increases a person's chance of developing a disease.

Studies have found the following risk factors for kidney cancer: Smoking (twice as likely); Obesity; High Blood Pressure; Long-term Dialysis; Von Hippel-Lindau (VHL) Syndrome (a rare disease that runs in some families caused by changes in the VHL gene); Occupation (certain chemicals or substances in the workplace such as coke oven workers in the iron and steel industry or workers exposed to asbestos or cadmium); Gender (males are more likely than females). Most people who have these risk factors do not get kidney cancer. On the other hand, most people who do get the disease have no known risk factors. People who think they may be at risk should discuss this concern with their doctor. The doctor may be able to suggest ways to reduce the risk and can plan an appropriate schedule for checkups.

#### **SYMPTOMS**

Common symptoms of kidney cancer include: Blood in the urine (making the urine slightly rusty to deep red); Pain in the side that does not go away; A lump or mass in the side of the abdomen; Weight loss; Fever; Feeling very tired or having a general feeling of poor health. Most often, these symptoms do not mean cancer. An infection, a cyst, or another problem also can cause the same symptoms. A person with any of these symptoms should see a doctor so that any problem can be diagnosed and treated as early as possible.

#### **DIAGNOSIS**

If a patient has symptoms that suggest kidney cancer, the doctor may perform one or more of the following procedures: Physical exam; Urine tests; Blood tests; Intravenous pyelogram (IVP); CT scan; Ultrasound test; Biopsy; Surgery.

#### Words of Comfort

This meditation is the second in a series based on the supporting scriptural references of the Comforter Ministry Mission Statement, found in the Comforter Ministry journal, and previously printed in Comforter Ministry Newsletters. They are being reprinted here and in following issues of CMN.

Now it is God who makes both us and you stand firm in Christ. He anointed us, set his seal of ownership on us, and put his Spirit in our hearts as a deposit, guaranteeing what is to come. 2 Corinthians 1:21, 22

#### God's Glorious Guarantee

If purchasing a big-ticket item such as a car or house most of us will find ourselves at our local bank, sitting at the desk of a loan officer with high hopes we can convince him we are capable enough to repay the loan in a timely manner if he would simply loan us the money and take our word for it - we are trustworthy.

In most cases, we will be expected to put some money down to show we are earnest in our desire to buy the car or house and pay the full amount agreed upon between seller and buyer. Once again, we want the seller to understand we are serious about the purchase of their car or house and they can consider us capable and trustworthy buyers.

Signing papers that reflect we intend to take ownership, offering earnest money as a guarantee that the whole will be forthcoming, shaking hands on the deal made between buyer and seller, are all gestures made to insure the deal is now sealed and both buyer and seller have guaranteed the sale is an official agreement between both parties, promising to uphold their individual end of things.

We might think that is the way it will be as we try and work out our relationship with God and receive His Son, Jesus, into our hearts. We'll simply sit down with God and negotiate a reasonable agreement with Him concerning our sins; sins which separate us from Him and any possibility of faith in Jesus. We'll try and convince God we are capable enough (we haven't killed anyone or stolen anything of real value). We intend to be trustworthy - we do give generously to the church we currently attend and towards the needs of those in our community; but also admit we tend to be a bit lazy and self-centered more times than not. God certainly understands if we default every now and then. And it's not that we aren't serious about loving God and believing in Jesus as our Savior from sin and the Giver of eternal life through faith in Him; however, there are times when it just isn't reasonable or realistic to expect every month the payment will be on time and complete. Our gestures to insure the deal is sealed can seem so sincere and official; at the same time so empty and meaningless when we truly understand who we are dealing with.

2 Corinthians 1:21, 22 gives us a completely different picture and explanation. God does all the gesturing and guaranteeing. He picks us up out of the dung heap of sin; He washes our sins away by the blood of Jesus, the Lamb; He clothes us with Jesus' righteousness, a white robe that reflects purity and holiness only Jesus can produce. At our baptism and through the Word, God gives us the Holy Spirit (the Comforter/ Counselor) as a seal, guaranteeing the believer's future inheritance. As one commentary puts it, "In Christ, through the anointing of the Spirit, God has paid for us the earnest-money of our salvation, and now He guarantees the delivery of that redemption, the consummation of our Christian hopes...God pays the earnest-money in the blood of His Son, He anoints us to know and believe His plan for the salvation of the world, He seals this knowledge in our hearts, He guarantees the full enjoyment of all our hopes."

Dear Reader: With God's help, cling to the guarantee God provides through faith in His Son, Jesus; trust in God's deposit in you, guaranteeing your inheritance; take hold of His faithful promises to you; reject all self-reliance; rely in God's glorious guarantee.
